SCHOOL HOUSE SYSTEM & INTRAMURAL EVENTS


Manchester International School's house-wise intramural competition system involves assigning students to one of four houses, each named after significant mythological horses: <u>Chetak</u> - Stallion of Maharana Pratap; <u>Pankti</u> - One of the seven horses designated to carry Sun-God's chariot; <u>Sarangi</u> - Horse of the brave queen Rani Lakshmi; <u>Kanthaka</u>- Buddha's Royal Horse. These houses serve as close-knit communities with distinct colors, slogans, and visions, promoting a strong sense of belonging.

Throughout the academic year, various inter-house competitions are held, spanning sports tournaments, academic quizzes, cultural events, public speaking, and debates. Older students assume the role of house captains, responsible for organizing and motivating their members, and fostering healthy competition and camaraderie.

MIS prioritizes participation and personal growth over winning at all costs, emphasizing holistic development. Points earned by houses are tallied, with winning houses receiving trophies and recognition in award ceremonies.

The house with the most points at year-end claims the prestigious "House of the Year" title.
